


Senior Checklists

<u>MYTH #1:</u> *My parents make too much money, so I won't qualify for any aid.*

FACT: The reality is there's no income cut-off to qualify for federal student aid. It doesn't matter if you have a low or high income; most people qualify for some type of financial aid, including low-interest

federal student loans. Many factors besides income—such as your family size and your year in school—are considered to determine your aid package.

TIP: When you fill out the FAFSA form, you're automatically applying for funds from your state, and possibly from your school, in addition to federal student aid. In fact, some schools won't even consider you for any of their scholarships (including academic scholarships) until you've submitted a FAFSA form. Don't make assumptions about what you'll get—fill out the application and find out!

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid opened on October 1st. The FAFSA is required for students to qualify for federal and/or institutional aid. No matter what path you choose after graduation, completing the FAFSA will open doors for education and training. Below are a few resources that can help you with your FAFSA completion!
